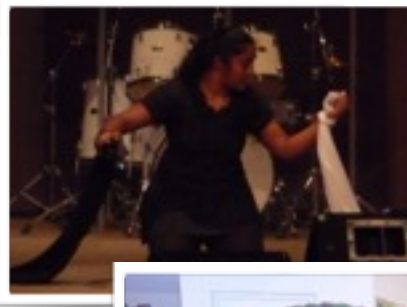

Thai Pongal

The Tamil Cultural and Academic Society of Durham (TCASD) is committed to instilling positive values in children and youth by motivating them to participate in various cultural and academic events. The Tamils in the Durham region were fortunate to celebrate the Tamil Heritage Vizha of "Thai Pongal" with families, friends, political leaders who supported the achievement of the proclamation of the Tamil Heritage month, Tamil organizations and various community groups. TCASD is very proud and thankful to Town of Ajax and the City of Pickering for the declaration of our Heritage month of Thai. The Pongal event was celebrated at the Ajax Community Centre with over 200 people in attendance. The hall was decorated with the traditional lamps, ("kurthu oli") coconut leaves, beautiful Kolam, and clay pots on the table as the centrepiece. The Pongal pani was set up in a special place facing the Sun God. TCASD's talented children brought the sun into the room with their talented art work. The guests and children had an opportunity to pour the freshly harvested rice, in significance of Prosperity, Peace and Happiness. The Pongal was prepared and shared with all the guests, along with delicious home made food prepared by TCASD members. The Town of Ajax Mayor presented the Tamil Heritage month proclamation to TCASD. The youths and children kept our audience entertained with

traditional Pongal songs, dances and creative crafts and meaningful speeches. More over, it was a great family event to unite the community. In celebrating Tamil Heritage month, TCASD presented the Town of Ajax and the City of Pickering with a decorated pongal pot and wooden spoon to display. In addition to that, TCASD presented new Tamil books to the Oshawa, Ajax and Pickering library. Four Tamil women from TCASD were recognized by MP Hon. Chris Alexander for their volunteer work, their leadership to TCASD and to the community. Peace & Harmony Community Concert

On March 3rd 2012, the youth members of the Tamil Cultural and Academic Society of Durham (TCASD) participated in the Peace and Harmony Community Concert, hosted by Mr. Roland Rutland, the External Affairs Co-ordinator for the Durham Bahai' Community. The Concert was held at the Forest Brook Community Church, Ajax. The main goal of the concert was to promote diversity and humanitarian rights. The youth of TCASD did two beautiful dances, both to represent diversity and human rights. One of the dances was named as "Breaking the Ties." It was performed and choreographed by Vashinie Kamesan. The dance was created based on the idea of metaphorically tying and bringing down the dreams of a girl. The dancers' hands were tied with black and white knots to symbolize different stereotypes and stigmas affecting the life of a girl. At the end of the dance, the dancer broke free from the knots, symbolically representing a girl becoming independent. The second one was the Peacock dance, which originated from India. The peacock dance has some religious significance to the Hinduism. Also, it is the National Bird of India. The peacock dance is performed through the rainy seasons. This very popular "Peacock Dance" was performed by Meka Ratnarajah, Thanya Maniam and Taneeka Thirukumar and was choreographed by Tanesha Thirukumar.

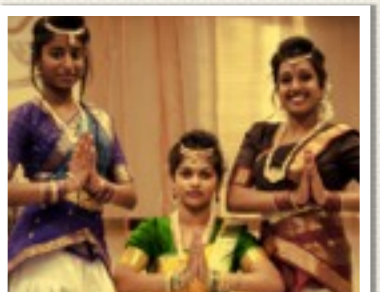
